Equipment procurement update: Notice to qualified bidders

As construction of our new health complex progresses, focus is being placed on equipment selection and preparing for the move to the new facility which will open in the spring of 2013. There will be various milestones to be achieved involving the tendering of 17 major equipment packages over the next year. To date, the following packages have been active:

Background information:

The Niagara Health System (NHS) is Ontario's largest multi-site hospital amalgamation comprised of seven sites serving 434,000 residents across the 12 municipalities making up the Regional Municipality of Niagara. The NHS is currently constructing a brand-new, state-of-the-art health complex on a Greenfield site in west St. Catharines to replace the aging St. Catharines General Site and Ontario Street Site (formerly the Hotel Dieu Hospital). The new health complex will offer acute and critical inpatient services, surgical, emergency and ambulatory services under one roof for the residents of St. Catharines, Thorold, Niagara-on-the Lake and the immediate area; as well as providing new regional services never before available in Niagara, including treatments for cancer, heart disease and longer-term mental health disease.

The NHS has partnered with Plenary Health Niagara to design, build, finance and maintain the new facility for approximately 34 years, ensuring it is built on time and on budget. Our construction partner PCL Constructors Canada Inc. commenced work on site in April of 2009. Construction will be complete in November 2012, with the facility opening its doors to patients in the spring of 2013.

Installation of the 25,000 plus equipment items will take place between the summer of 2011 and November 2012. Plenary Health Niagara and the NHS will follow several overriding principles to guide this transparent process. The final equipment selections will be made by the NHS in keeping with policies and Broader Public Sector (BPS) Procurement Directives, while recognizing that existing and regional standards may be in place.

Further details regarding potential future business opportunities will be made known to the public as they develop; including the procurement of equipment, supplies and services.
